These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – In ch. 2, we saw 3 philosophies from the characters in the Good Samaritan story. Which philosophy describes your life up until the present?

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The 3 Philosophies in chapter 2 are:

- 1. from the robbers "What's yours in mine and I am going to get it"
- 2. from the priest and Levite "What's mine is mine and I am going to keep it"
- 3. from the Samaritan "What's mine is yours and I want to share it"

The answer is personal and will vary from person to person.

Questions 2 – What are 2 lessons that you learned from the thief dying next to Jesus on the cross next to Jesus in ch. 9?

2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

There are many lessons discussed in the chapter that we can learn from the thieves on the cross. First, that man is naturally sinful. despite the reality that were hanging on crosses themselves, they still managed to mock Jesus. Second we see that for a man to be saved he must change his attitude about his own sin and recognize that he deserves judgement. Third, a man must not only repent but put his faith in Jesus to be saved. acknowledging sin isn't enough, we must take the further step of placing our trust in Christ for salvation.

Additionally, we learn that a man is not saved by good works, the thief had no opportunity to "turn his life around". Salvation is also not through baptism. Jesus promised the thief paradise, yet he was never baptized. Next, we learn that his assurance of his salvation was not based on his subjective feelings but on the promise of Jesus. We also learn that believers in Jesus go directly to be with Him immediately after death, "Today, you will be with Me in Paradise."

Lastly, we learn that a person can be saved in the final moments of their death if they place their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.
