THE HEART OF VOLUNTEERS

A March 2010 article from AARP reported that a record number of "Boomers" and older Americans volunteered on their own, independently of formal organizations, increasing from 34% in 2003 to 57% in 2009. In addition, "the nature of civic engagement is changing, becoming more personal and more secular... less likely to join organizations." The chief motivation given by 68% of the respondents is "feeling a personal responsibility to help others when they need it." However, though volunteers in 2003 reported working an average of 15 hours per month, in 2009 volunteers report spending an average of six to ten hours of service per month.

Write-Way Prison Ministries has been honored to have the "cream of the crop" volunteers on board. Not only do they serve diligently, but for long periods of time. There are at least a dozen active members who have been with WPM for more than 15 years, not to mention Mr. Nichols who is in his 28th year of leading this school!

For 2009 WPM is estimated to have operated on the shoulders of more than 400 volunteers who worked 85,020 hours in various schedules and locations. That's a \$616,395.00 labor value (at minimum wage)! Surely Paul's prayer in Colossians 1:10 is answered: "being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God."

HOW I TRUSTED CHRIST: "The second time I went to prison I was literally insane for two years. I was mad at God, the judge, the prosecutor, my lawyers, and myself for not knowing how I came to let myself be put in a position to where I was given a 35 year sentence. I felt it was unjustified so I was a raving mad lunatic, cussing and fighting for those two years.

"One day, Sunday, I was going to recreation, passing the gym where services were held. I heard what sounded like a choir in heaven singing. I passed on by but somehow found myself back at the door, looking in and listening to the heavenly sound. Suddenly I realized where I was standing and said, 'No! I ain't going in!' This happened three times and the third time the Spirit compelled me to go in. I made the altar call that day begging God to for-give me with tears pouring from my eyes. I was born again that day in January, 1995."

SINCE I HAVE TRUSTED CHRIST: "By God's grace I have weathered many trials and temptations, going through the 'tempering fire' so to speak. I know today that Satan is real. I know today that God Almighty is real and all-powerful, merciful, and righteous in all that He does. I do not hate anyone anymore, but I do hate the sin which defiles us. Dear Friends,

As this issue goes into the mail, the ECS Prison Conference on June 2-5 is history. But I wanted to share with you several prominent themes. First, an ex-felon is usually present at the conferences giving us a first-hand testimony as to the benefits of these correspondence courses. Joseph Cabral from California tenderly and firmly testified of his pilgrimage and commitment to Christ and we all were delighted to embrace him as a brother in Christ.

Secondly, ECS reported that the number of Hispanic courses distributed has increased by 36% over the last ten years. Unfortunately, as the Hispanic population rises, so does the Hispanic prison population. We badly need a Spanish coordinator to help us with translation and communication to our Spanish volunteers.

The highlight of the conference was the two sessions by Lenny Spitale (that's three Italian syllables), author of *Prison Ministry: Understanding Prison Culture Inside And Out.* You can buy the book on <u>www.amazon.com</u> at discount and read reviews. You need to read it! As an exoffender and now prison minister, Lenny exuded enthusiasm for his subject with the sparkle of his Italian background. His first point was the deficiency of fathers in inmates' lives. Absence, abuse, neglect. Then he helped us understand that prison has a culture all its own and that successful ministry needs to familiarize itself with this special culture.

In closing, Lenny led us through several changes taking place in and out of the prison culture that might affect our outreach in the future.

- Supermax prisons with restrictions on access.
- Budget cuts, particularly in Human Services.
- Less chaplains; in CA the ratio recommended is 1 to 500. Actual is 1 to 4,000.
- Religious pluralism more attention being given to rights of other religions and cults.
- The increase of gang activity (something to be loyal to).
- Female juveniles are on the increase.
- The appearance of "Hospice" units due to aging "lifers."
- The rise in infectious diseases (hepatitis C and HIV).
- Political correctness (Canadian PC's cannot distribute DTWJ due to references to homosexuals).

In spite of these potential obstacles, Lenny encouraged us to be intentional about "passing the baton" of salvation to the incarcerated. The obstacles listed above may reduce the number of volunteers who can go into the prisons. But since we specialize in correspondence courses, <u>the mail</u> <u>can go where we may not be able to go!</u> Lenny affirmed that our greatest work is yet to come. His final word:

• The church that receives a former inmate has a treasure, a spiritual "fire in their lap!"

We have a great work and the Lord is obviously at work. Let us know today of your desire to join us!

YOU MADE A DIFFERENCE!!

Thank you for putting us on your Kroger Plus card when shopping. We have gone from \$108 the first year to over \$780 in Kroger donations in 2009. That's more than 218 students served with a course sent and an exam returned.



RALPH MARION NICHOLS

May 30, 1918 - July 5, 2010 Des Moines, Iowa – Mesquite, Texas

For 28 years Ralph Nichols led Write-Way Prison Ministries from a kitchen table in his home to a spacious headquarters building sitting on an acre of land in Garland, Texas. He started with a handful of inmate exams. He lived to see the correspondence school grow to minister to more than 9,700 students per month housed in Texas and Louisiana Federal and State prisons and County and Parish jails. He was resourceful and intense in his endeavor to serve the "least of these."

He knew the task of reaching over 300,000 Texas and Louisiana prisoners with the Gospel of Jesus Christ and discipling them was daunting. He tackled this challenge

with his wife, Dorothy M. Nichols, by developing "Branches." Volunteers from local churches form a support group to grade and counsel each exam in order to provide the student with personal and positive feedback. Write-Way began with an all volunteer staff and non-profit status in 1982. It continues to this day, now with volunteers numbering over 400. Ralph performed his duties as President of the WPM Board and Director of the school to his last moment. He celebrated his 92nd birthday on May 30, 2010.

A TESTIMONY

On April 25. 2010 Ralph Nichols met with a group of interested volunteers from Believers Chapel here in Dallas. It would be the final grading/counseling Branch in which he would oversee its formation. This would be Branch #78, and would bring to 31 the number of active Branches.

Mike Amis, an elder at Believers Chapel, encountered the Write-Way courses while teaching at the Moore prison unit in Bonham, Texas. While there he met and taught an inmate who was a WPM student. That inmate has now been paroled, lives in Dallas and has a full time job. Recently he applied to be a grader counselor. To quote Mr. Amis:

"Terry was recently released from the prison unit located at Nacogdoches. Prior to that, he had been at Choice Moore Unit, Bonham, where he actively participated in the Experiencing God class Rick Kingsley and I lead.

Terry attended our class weekly for about two years, and I learned that he was a sincere student of the Bible, often indicating a mature knowledge of God's Word and doctrinal truth in alignment with the Write-Way Statement of Faith. Terry informs me he has completed all of the Write-Way courses... I believe that Terry's role as a grader/counselor would benefit both him and the students involved."

Mr. Nichols was proud to hear one of his students graduated the courses, got out of prison, and then wanted to join WPM. Terry officially became a WPM counselor exactly one day before Mr. Nichols went home to rest in His Savior's arms.



President Rodger Turley will also sit as the Director of the Correspondence School as did his predecessor, Ralph Nichols. Trustees, Esther Robinson and Delwin Rettig, joined the WPM Board in June, 2010.

While working with Hunt Oil Company in their Dallas payroll department, Rodger joined Ralph in 1998 on evenings and Saturdays to learn the various tasks. In 2007 he was appointed as a penal coordinator by ECS. Upon retirement in January, 2008, Rodger joined the volunteer staff full time.

Over a decade ago Rodger starting writing some of the students and that led to prison visitations. Because "aftercare" is such a desperate need, Rodger leased a house until 2009 and over four years housed 15 different parolees. In addition, he has been on 14 Weekend of Champions with the Bill Glass ministries, visiting and sharing with inmates in their pods and cells. 

HOW I TRUSTED CHRIST

"I was born in Fort Worth to a drug and alcohol family. When my parents did not want anything to do with me or my other siblings, they would lock us in a room and give us one candy bar, one soda, and one bag of chips to share. They never went to church.

"When I was two years old some people from CPS came and got us and found a new family who adopted us all. They used to take us to church, but I never understood who that man on the cross was. As I was growing up I started to be a problem to my parents. I acted up, then was suspended from school, and found myself going to and from jail.

"It was on a very cold and windy night under a bridge in San Antonio and a ministry was passing out clothes and blankets. Just think, I was one of those homeless individuals! These people had services and talked about how they used to be lost in sin until they asked the Lord Jesus to come into their heart. After the service, one of the guys ministered to us in the back of his truck and stood there with his arms stretched out. That night in Dec 2008 I finally asked God and His Son, Jesus Christ, to come into my heart and become the Lord and Savior over my life. He has blessed me in so many ways." Gerald
