These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – After reading chapter 2 of the course, what is the safest method of explaining how Christ emptied Himself (Philippians 2.7)?

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

When discussing how Jesus, the Son of God became a human (the Incarnation), we must be careful in our explanation. The safest explanation of His *emptying* is to let the rest of the verse explain the process. Jesus emptied Himself by taking on humanity and, even more specifically, the role of a servant. The next verses lay out the humbling involved in the emptying, which included dying. And not just dying any death but dying on a cross

Questions 2 – What is the story behind the letter to Philemon?

2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

This very short letter is written to Philemon, who was the previous master/owner of the slave named Onesimus. Philemon had been saved through the ministry of Paul and, later, after Onesimus had run away from his master, Onesimus also believed in Jesus through Paul's ministry and had faithfully served and ministered to Paul. It appears that Paul and Onesimus determined that it was best for Onesimus to return to Philemon and makes things right with his master. Paul writes the letter to Philemon exhorting him and encouraging him to receive Onesimus warmly as if Onesimus was Paul himself and to extend grace to Onesimus.
