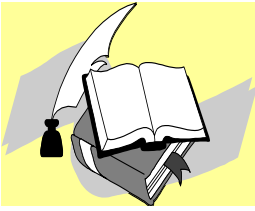

BLESSINGS FROM PRISON

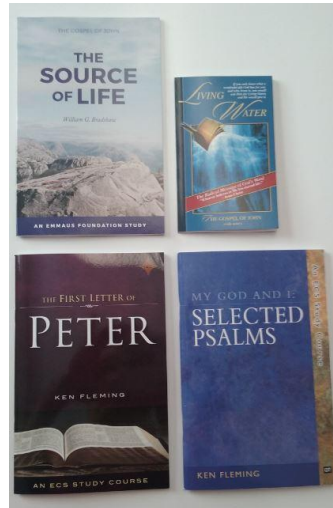

Dear Friends,

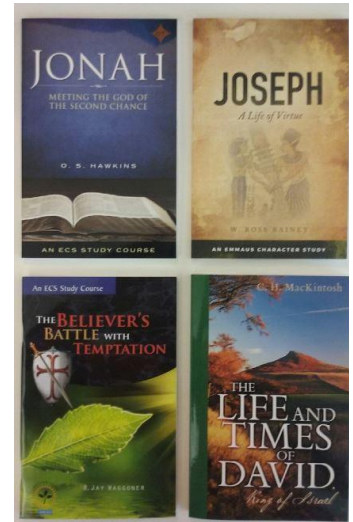
What a difference a month makes! Fires, hurricanes, and earthquakes stole the headlines from our national political unrest. Three of our nine Branches in the Houston area have shut down temporarily until their volunteers, churches, and post offices are restored. That affected 633 students!

TDCJ evacuated five of their state prisons south of Houston – 5,900 inmates. All five are being repopulated as this newsletter goes out. And that affected 150 of our students. In total, 20 of their prisons were affected, hundreds of employees unable to get to work, and homes flooded. Please see Prayer Corner below for specifics—the volunteers, the churches, and the students. Thank you for your fervent prayers.

ECS WORLD WIDE NUMBERS in 2016

1,437,700 courses distributed in 2016.
That's 2.7 per minute, 163 per hour,
and 3,912 per day.
1,040,283 courses completed in 2016.
That's a 72% return rate.

Emmaus Correspondence School (ECS) goes back to 1942 when Belgian Congo missionary, Ed Harlow, returned to the states and wrote courses for the new Emmaus Bible School in Toronto. Others wanted access to these excellent materials and so was born the first of many correspondence courses and eventually ECS. Today ECS has 1,200 distributors in 100 countries in 80 languages.

In 1977 William McDonald wrote *Born to Win* for prisoners. Now there are 34 state coordinators who provide a curriculum (up to 94 courses available) for prisoners throughout the states.

Except for the seven Navigator booklets, all Write-Way courses come from ECS – 62 in English and 48 in Spanish. In 2016 Write-Way distributed 75,526 courses to Texas and Louisiana prisoners.
