These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – What 3 lessons do we learn about walking away from the Lord from Jonah's fall in chapter 1 of the course? How have these lessons impacted you?

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The author mentions 3 lessons from Jonah's fall in ch.1: 1. Jonah's fall was <u>calculated</u>. Jonah took deliberate steps to find a ship heading as far from what God had called him to as possible. 2. His fall was <u>continuous</u>. He spiraled downwards until he hit rock bottom (or ocean bottom). 3. It was <u>costly</u>. It not only cost Jonah money, but the cost included pain, suffering and almost his life.

2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

First, by *seizing the opportunities* God gives us to obey again. God always gives us second chances and in those second chances we have the opportunity to obey, where we have failed before. Second, we *sense our obligation*. We are obliged to teach and proclaim the Word of God. Not our own opinions or thoughts, but we are present His message and persuade people to Him.
