These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – In Psalms 1:2 the righteous man *delights in the Law of the Lord and on His law he* meditates day and night. Describe what it means to meditate day and night and how you can do this.

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

To meditate means to purposefully engage with the Word using our conscious minds. To discipline our minds to un-distractedly look at and think through what the Bible says and apply it to everything we do and say. It a passion for the Word that goes over the text in our minds constantly (*day & night*) and considers its implications. To do this, one would need to set aside a time, remove themselves from all distractions, and focus on a portion of God's Word. Then think about it all day.

1 - HELPFUL COMMENTS

It would be helpful to encourage the student to spend time meditating on the Bible and to actually get into the discipline of reading and thinking about a passage. Share with them some of the blessings you've received from your own time meditating on the Word.

1 - VERSES

All of Psalm 119 is a poem about the beauty of God's Word; 2 Timothy 3:16

Questions 2 – In Psalm 32, the author notes 3 different terms used to describe sin; describe each kind and how, in the New Testament, Jesus' death on the cross takes care of each. 2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The 3 terms used for sin are: 1) *transgression* which is deliberately crossing the line between right and wrong... to rebel; 2) *sin* which is "to miss the mark"; to deviate from the path that pleases God; 3) *iniquity* which is the inward perversion of our nature that manifests itself in wrongdoing. The cross provides a solution for each of these types of sin. Jesus is the *scapegoat* for our transgressions, carrying away our sins so that we are forgiven. His blood provides *atonement* (a covering) for our sins. Through His death we are *justified* (declared righteous) and our faith is credited as righteousness.

2 - HELPFUL COMMENTS

All of our sin is taken care of at the Cross of Jesus Christ! His work is complete and finished!

2 - VERSES

John 1:29; Romans 3.21-30; 4:3-5; 1 Peter 1:2

WHAT DO YOU SAY?

These questions are designed to help the student express their thoughts, feelings, and opinions about something they have learned from the chapter.

EXAM 1 – What changes will you make in your life as a result of meditating on Psalm 1? 1 - COMMENTS

- James 3:15-17 The wisdom that is from above is first pure ... without partiality and without hypocrisy.

EXAM 2 – Share one way in which you have personally experienced God's shepherding care. 2 - COMMENTS

- <u>Heb. 13:20-21</u> May the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead ... make you complete in every good work to do His will.
- <u>Matt. 11:28-29</u> Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

Rest/Leads: <u>Ps. 23:2-3</u> He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake.

Restores: <u>Ps. 23:3</u> He restores my soul.

Encourages/Comforts: <u>Ps. 23:4</u> Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me

Protects/Heals: <u>Ps. 23:5</u> You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; My cup runs over.

Confidence for Future: <u>Ps. 23:6</u> Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life; and I will dwell in the house of the Lord Forever.

EXAM 3 – David closes the psalm with an exhortation to "wait on the Lord." In what areas of your life do you need to wait on God?

Trusting God: <u>Isa. 26:3-4</u> You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You.

Walk by faith in God: <u>Heb. 11:6</u> Without faith it is impossible to please Him.

Wait on the Lord: <u>Ps. 37:9</u> Evildoers shall be cut off, but those who wait on the Lord, they shall inherit the earth.

• <u>Isa. 40:31</u> Those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength.

EXAM 4 – According to this psalm, what is the best reaction when the Holy Spirit confronts you with sin in your life, and why?

EXAM 5 – Think about a time when God delivered you from a difficult situation. How did <u>that change the way you relate to Him and others?</u>

- <u>Ps. 111:10</u> The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.
- <u>Heb. 13:5</u> I will never leave you nor forsake you.

EXAM 6 – Using these two psalms, discuss why turning to God is the best antidote for <u>depression.</u>
