These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – Describe how the red heifer sacrifice, described in Numbers 19, is a type of Christ.

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The red heifer was sacrificed to cleanse a person who had become ceremonially unclean due to contact with a dead body or unclean food. Christ's sacrifice on the cross also cleanses our conscience from dead works. Both the red heifer and Jesus were killed outside the camp (Hebrews 13:11). **1 - HELPFUL COMMENTS**

Questions 2 – Describe the differences between Saul and David that are discussed in ch 7. What can we learn from the failings of Saul?

2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

Saul was not completely obedient on several occasions. He was self-willed and often took matters into his own hands. When he was confronted on these issues he made excuses and was not fully repentant. David, on the other hand, sought to be completely obedient and reliant on God's leading. He often refused to take matters into his own hands and when he did, he did not make excuses but repented.

- <u>Col. 1:16-18</u> By Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth.
- <u>Rom. 1:20</u> God reveals Himself in creation.
- <u>Ps. 19:1</u> The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament shows His handiwork.

- <u>Ps. 148:5</u> He commanded and they were created.
- <u>Isa. 45:18</u> God's Word says He created all things.
- <u>Heb. 11:3</u> By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.
- <u>Gen. 1:1-37; 2:7</u> God created all the wonders of the universe, He created all things, both large and small.

- <u>Gen. 12:1-3</u> Abraham, the originator of the chosen people.
- <u>Gen. 25:19–27:46</u> Isaac, the first link in the continuation of the chosen people.
- <u>Gen. 28:1–36:43</u> Jacob, the family expansion of God's chosen people.
- <u>Gen. 37:1-50</u> Joseph, God's instrument for the preservation of the Israelites in Egypt. These were all men of faith, endurance, and obedience to God.

- <u>Eph. 1:7</u> In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace.
- <u>Rom. 3:24</u> Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.
- <u>Col. 1:14</u> In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.

- <u>Rom. 1:18-20; 2:9-11</u> God is angry at all sin and will in time pronounce judgment against all of those who practice it.
- <u>Col. 3:1-4</u> Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth.

- <u>2 Tim. 3:14</u> David remained faithful in all circumstances.
- <u>Heb. 11:32-34</u> (David who) who through faith subdued kingdoms.
- James 4:6 Saul was prideful and God opposes the proud.

EXAM 8 – What solemn truth about sin do we see in David's sin with Bathsheba? 8 - COMMENTS

8 - VERSES

• <u>Gal. 6:7-8</u> Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap.

- <u>Rom. 4:7-8</u> Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered.

- John 14:15, 21, 23; 15:10 Those who love Him, keep His commandments.
