These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – What are 4 of the ways that a person can tell that they are a lover of righteousness (ch. 7)?

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The course list 7 questions to ask to determine of you are a lover of righteousness:

- 1) Do I seek to walk each day in the way of goodness and in the paths of righteousness?
- 2) Can it be said of me that all the words of my mouth are righteous and nothing perverse or evil comes out of it?
- 3) Can it be said of me that I am honest, I tell the truth and do not lie?
- 4) Can it be said of me that I sow righteous? That I seek opportunities to do good?
- 5) Do I "justify the wicked" or "condemn the righteous"? Do I enjoy when someone innocent is punished or when the guilty get away with evil?
- 6) Can it be sai of me that I hate the way of the wicked and love those who walk in righteousness?
- 7) Can it be said of me that I'd rather be poor and righteous than rich and wicked? Am I generous or greedy?

These questions are helpful for us to search our heart and identify areas that need improvement or confession.

Questions 2 – There are several Proverbs on pride listed in ch. 10, select one that is meaningful to you and comment on it.

2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

Because this answer will vary from student to student, I will list the passages from Proverbs that are in chapter 10:

- Proverbs 21:4 Haughty eyes and a proud heart, the lamp of the wicked, are sin
- Proverbs 11:2 When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with the humble is wisdom.
- Proverbs 13:10 By insolence comes nothing but strife, but with those who take advice is wisdom
- Proverbs 14:3 Wealth gained hastily will dwindle, but whoever gathers little by little will increase it.
- Proverbs 16:5 Everyone who is arrogant in heart is an abomination to the Lord; be assured, he will not go unpunished.
- Proverbs 16:18-19 Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall.
- Proverbs 18:12 Before destruction a man's heart is haughty, but humility comes before honor.
- Proverbs 21:24 Scoffer is the name of the arrogant, haughty man who acts with arrogant pride.
- Proverbs 22:4 The reward for humility and fear of the Lord is riches and honor and life.
- Proverbs 29:23 One's pride will bring him low, but he who is lowly in spirit will obtain honor.

- Proverbs 3:34 Toward the scorners he is scornful, but to the humble he gives favor.
- Proverbs 15:33 The fear of the Lord is instruction in wisdom, and humility comes before honor.
- Proverbs 25:27 It is not good to eat much honey, nor is it glorious to seek one's own glory.
- Proverbs 27:2 Let another praise you, and not your own mouth; a stranger, and not your own lips.

- <u>2 Tim. 1:7</u> God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind
- <u>1 John 4:18</u> There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love.

- <u>2 Cor. 6:14-16</u> Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers.
- <u>Matt. 5:28</u> I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

- <u>Rom. 13:14</u> Put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts.
- <u>1 Cor. 6:18</u> Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body.
- <u>1 Thess. 4:1-5</u> You should abstain from sexual immorality
- <u>1 Cor. 7:2</u> Nevertheless, because of sexual immorality, let each man have his own wife, and let each woman have her own husband. (Because God has established marriage).

- <u>Phil. 3:9</u> Not having my own righteousness, ... but that which is through faith in Christ.
- <u>Prov. 10:30</u> The righteous will never be removed, but the wicked will not inhabit the earth.
- <u>Prov. 11:19</u> As righteousness leads to life, so he who pursues evil pursues it to his own death.

- John 8:44 The devil ... he was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. He is a liar and the father of it.
