These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – Using ch. 2 of the course (as well as 1 Thess. 2), describe 3 characteristics of Paul's ministry among the Thessalonians. How does your service compare to Paul's?

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

Paul lists 6 characteristics of his service in 1 Thessalonians 2:

- 1. Steadfastness in the face of suffering and shame. Paul had endured much physical suffering and shame for his preaching of the gospel and instead of deterring him, it made him more bold in his proclamation.
- 2. Seeking approval of God rather than men. Paul was not ashamed before men because he was not seeking to make them like him; Paul's only goal was to stand before God faithful.
- 3. Sincere, not seek self-advancement. Paul had no personal agendas or ulterior motives for doing his work. His ministry was purely out of love for Christ and His church.
- 4. Gentleness, as a mother. Paul had the same maternal tenderness for the Thessalonians as a mother caring for her young.
- 5. Selfless service. Paul was willing to expend himself sacrificially for the sake of the Thessalonians and the gospel.
- 6. Spotless standard of Christian conduct. Paul's ministry was above reproach in everyway so that no one could legitimately bring accusation against him.

Sanctification in 1 Thessalonians 4 can be seen in abstaining from sexual immorality. More specifically that we are self-controlled and pure through the help of the Spirit not driven by our fleshly passions.

Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself.
- <u>1 Peter 3:8</u> All of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous.
