These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 - What does nature tell us about God?

1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The first 2 chapters of the course discuss the basic fact of God's existence. From nature/creation we learn about God's invisible attribute, namely His divine power and divine nature. The heavens also bear witness of His power given their grandeur and majesty. It can also point us to God's omnipresence because the world and the universe is so vast and God rules and administrates all of it. Cf. Romans 1:19-20; Psalm 8:3-4; 19:1; 139:7-18.

Questions 2 - What is the significance of Christ's death?

2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The death of Christ takes up a disproportionate amount of space in the gospels when compared to His life. The New Testament describes Jesus as the Lamb of God and His death is sufficient to cover the sins of the whole world. His sacrifice is only efficient for those who come by faith. He gave His life for the sins of the whole world; He died in our place.

EXAM 1 – What truth about God in this chapter impresses you the most, and why?

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1 - VERSES

- Ps. 19:1 The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament shows His handiwork.
- Ps. 139:1-6 The omniscience of God.
- Ps. 139:7-12 The omnipresence of God.
- Ps. 139:13-18 The omnipotence of God.
- <u>Jer. 29:11</u> I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.

EXAM 2 – What do you think is the greatest evidence that the Bible is divinely inspired? 2 - COMMENTS

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2 - VERSES

- <u>2 Peter 1:21</u> Prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit.
- 2 Tim. 3:16 All Scripture is given by inspiration of God.
- <u>1 Cor. 2:13</u> The Words of Scripture were taught by the Holy Spirit.

EXAM 3 – Why should it concern us that God is holy?

3 - COMMENTS

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3 - VERSES

- <u>1 Peter 1:15-16</u> He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct.
- Rev. 15:3-4 Great and marvelous are Your works, Lord God Almighty! Just and true are Your ways.
- Rev. 16:5 You are righteous, O Lord, the One who is and who was and who is to be.

EXAM 4 – Did you learn anything new about the law of God in this chapter? If so, what? 4 - COMMENTS

• For a thorough understanding and a lot of Scripture on this subject, reference or give to the student the Captive's Corner Restoring the Ten Commandments to Its God Given Place and Purpose or The Sabbath

4 - VERSES

- Rom. 6:13-14 You are not under law but under grace.
- Rom. 7:4 You have become dead to the law.
- Gal. 3:24-26 The Law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor.
- Gal. 5:17-18 If led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.
- Rom. 10:4 Christ is the end of the law for righteousness.
- Heb. 8:6-7, 13 The Old Covenant of Moses with its Ten Commandments has ended and has been replaced by a better covenant with a new law, the law of Christ. Christ is the Christian's law-giver, not Moses. The Christian should not look back to Moses for his rule of conduct anymore than he looks back to Aaron (Israel's high priest) for forgiveness of sin.
- <u>John 13:34</u> Jesus said, A new commandment I give to you.
- Matt. 5:21-22, 27-28 Jesus said, you have heard ... but I say.
- Gal. 6:2 Bear others burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.
- 1 Cor. 9:21 Christians are under the law of Christ, not Moses.
- Gal. 3:10-13 Cursed is everyone who does not continue in all things ... in the ... law. Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law. If you live by the law of Moses as a Christian, you must keep it perfectly or be condemned in your conscience when you fail because this is the law principle.
- Eph. 2:14-15 He abolished ... the law of commandments.
- Col. 2:14-17 Obviously a change has occurred if men are no longer judged by O.T. Sabbath laws and food laws.
- <u>John 1:18; Col. 2:17; Heb. 10:1</u> The Ten Commandments were only a shadow of God's moral character. Christ is the exact representation, or substance, of it. The Christian is a follower of Christ, not His shadow (<u>John 8:12</u>).
- John 14:21; Matt. 28:18 My (Jesus) commandment.
- Gal. 2:20; Col. 2:6-7; John 15:4-5; Phil. 4:13 Christ enables or empowers believers to obey Him by means of living in a
- relationship with Him. The Law of Moses did not and can not do this. So it only condemns

EXAM 5 – Why can't man be saved by works?

5 - COMMENTS

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5 - VERSES

• <u>Isa. 64:6</u> We are all like an unclean thing, and all our righteousness are like filthy rags.

- <u>Titus 3:5-7</u> Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit.
- Eph. 2:8-9 By grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast.
- Rom. 5:8 God commended His love towards us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us.

EXAM 6 – Why is it necessary for us to believe that Jesus Christ is sinless if we are to be saved?

6 - COMMENTS

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6 - VERSES

- <u>1 Peter 1:18-19</u> You were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.
- <u>1 Peter 3:18</u> Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God.
- 2 Cor. 5:21 He committed no sin.
- Heb. 9:13,14 If the blood of bulls and goats and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkling the unclean, sanctifies for the purifying of the flesh, how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

EXAM 7 – What is the difference between believing that Christ died for the world, and that Christ died for me?

7 - COMMENTS

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7 - VERSES

- <u>1 John 2:2</u> He Himself is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the whole world.
- Luke 19:10 The Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost.
- <u>2 Peter 3:9</u> The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

EXAM 8 – What have you learned in this course that you did not previously know?8 - COMMENTS

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8 - VERSES

- Rev. 3:15-16 Because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth.
- Matt. 6:24 When you pray, go into your room, and when you have shut your door, pray to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly.
- 1 John 5:12 He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life.
- <u>John 3:18</u> He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.
